Maths Lessons





- Mastery Curriculum spending more time on topics, developing fluency, reasoning and problem-solving skills.
- Use of concrete resources to aid understanding and engage learning. Lots of outdoor activities (weather permitting).
- Challenge boxes (linked to the topic) of easy access to the children.
- NCTEM Maths meetings 10 mins in the afternoon 2x a week to top up learning/close gaps.

Y1 & Y2 Numbots







- NumBots' focuses on improving the automatic recall of number facts as well as developing conceptual understanding.
- Pupils choose their own Bot before launching into 'Story' and 'Challenge' modes, where our algorithm takes care of their learning.
- For most effective practice we suggest playing for at least 3 minutes a day, 4 or 5 times a week.
- As they progress, pupils collect achievement badges and unlock hundreds of new levels and challenges.
- In the Story Mode they will also discover parts, helping RustyBot upgrade from Rust to Diamond - so he can shine inside and out.



TTRS -Y2 Focus on 2x, 5x and 10x



Times Tables Rock Stars is a maths programme that takes all the worry out of learning times tables and has a proven track record of boosting children's fluency and recall in multiplication and division. Suitable for all learners aged 6 years and up, our question-based games automatically adapt to each child's unique learning needs, helping them to recall their times tables in record speed. Accessible on any device, via the app or browser, children can play anytime, anywhere.

English Lessons



- Genres are taught through creatively responding to key fiction and non-fiction texts, linking where possible to the topic, allowing children to simultaneously develop reading and writing skills effectively.
- Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG) lessons.
- Daily Phonics sessions and handwriting sessions.

Spellings and Homework

- Spellings will be set each Tuesday, ready for a check the following Monday. These are based on sounds learned during phonics lessons and will include Year I and 2 statutory spellings or common exception words.
- Homework is set each Tuesday and due in the following Monday. It is usually an English and Maths activity but may vary according to special weeks or events.
- Please could all homework books be covered with sticky back plastic/strong brown paper.


Reading



- Every child should have a reading book in their bag daily and be reading for 10/15 mins each night.
- We remind children each morning if they need to change their books and to pop them into the box for the TA to change.
- We read daily as part of our English lessons but also during dedicated reading sessions.
- We are very lucky to have lots of wonderful volunteers who also listen to the children read over the course of the week. Each child should be heard read at least once a week.
- We love to hear about what the children have been reading during our reading sessions, and will be encouraging them to read a range of genres.
- I do check reading records occasionally, but they are mainly a tool for evidence of home reading. Please sign/comment 2x a week.

PE

• We have two PE sessions a week: Tuesday morning and Thursday afternoon. Both sessions are taught by a specialist sports coach and supported by the class TA or teacher.



- Children require a full PE kit each week:-
 - School PE t-shirt
 - Black shorts
 - Trainers (white or dark)
 - Black jogging bottoms and school sweatshirt (especially for outdoor PE and during winter)
 - Extra socks
- Long hair to be tied back and earrings removed/covered.
- Please ensure all items of kit are named.

Snacks, water bottles and boots!

- A fruit or veg snack may be brought into school to be eaten during break time. Please ensure your child's snack box is labelled. We also supply fruit and vegetable snacks each day for the class.
- A bottle of water may be kept in the classroom. Again, please ensure the water bottled is labelled. No juice please.
- Stationery: please ensure you child has access to the following: a pencil, pencil sharpener, ruler and rubber. Colouring pencils and felt tips are optional. These should be named. Pencil cases remain in bags during the school day.
- Wellington boots (named please) should be in school, especially for Forest Friday and wet lunches. We have a covered storage box just outside the classroom.









Playtime and lunchtime

- A morning break of 20 mins and an afternoon break of 10 mins. Friday morning break is skipping!
- Staff actively monitor and supervise with free access for the children to choose equipment.
- We encourage self-regulation/can you solve it yourself?
- BUT...children are encouraged to always tell an adult if they are worried/upset/injured – we can't help if we don't know!

Phonics Screening-Year 1 children



- Children in Year I take part in a phonics screening in June (week commencing 9th June 2025). Children in Year 2 will also take the check if they did not achieve the required result when in Year I or if they have not taken the test before.
- The test contains 40 words. Each child will sit one-to-one and read each word aloud to a teacher. The test will take approximately 10 minutes per child, but is not timed and can be at the child's pace. The list of words the children read is a combination of 20 real words and 20 pseudo words (nonsense words).
- The pseudo words will be shown to your child with a picture of an alien. This provides the children with a context for the pseudo word which is independent from any existing vocabulary they may have. Pseudo words are included because they will be new to all pupils; they do not favour children with a good vocabulary knowledge or visual memory of words.
- The results will be reported to you in summer term (as part of the end of year report) and will confirm if your child has met the standard threshold.



SATs -Year 2 children

- Traditionally have taken place in the middle of May but they are now an optional form of assessment and can be taken at any point in the summer term or not at all.
- A tool to further assess Maths and English alongside teacher judgement.
- Two maths papers, two reading papers, two SPAG papers.
- Marked and moderated by teachers within the school.
- Children are assessed as:
- working towards the expected standard
- working at the expected standard
- working at greater depth
- The results are shared in summer (as part of the end of year reports).
