

Pupil Voice: World Book Day 2024 – Poetry in Motion!

A Celebration of Poems, Performance and Play

World Book Day 2024 at Aston Rowant was a celebration of rhythm, rhyme and creativity. This year's theme centred on **Poetry**, and from the moment the children arrived, the school was full of imaginative costumes inspired by their favourite verses and rhymes. We welcomed a *fox in his socks*, a *cat in his hat*, characters from *Revolting Rhymes*, *nursery rhymes*, *Mrs Butler* (though no Derek Drew!), and many more inventive poetic creations.

The whole day was spent working in our mixed-age House teams, giving pupils the chance to explore a wide range of poetry in different styles and formats - from performance to blackout poetry, illustration to creative writing.

Hedgehog Class – Performance Poetry

Children learned how to bring poems to life using expression, volume and vocal changes. They experimented with performing lines loudly, softly, slowly and quickly.

Pupil Voice:

- *“I didn’t know my voice could make a poem sound completely different!”*
- *“I liked performing in a group because we sounded like a real show.”*

Squirrel Class – Newspaper & Blackout Poems

Using newspaper clippings, pupils cut out favourite words to build their own poems. They also created blackout poetry by removing words from a printed text until only their chosen poem remained.

Pupil Voice:

- *“It was like discovering a secret poem hidden inside the page.”*
- *“I liked choosing words that didn’t usually go together but still made a poem.”*

Fox Class – Alliteration, Personification & Magic Dust Poems

Starting with the shared opening line *“When I blew the magic dust...”*, pupils created their own poetic lines using alliteration and personification. Dictionaries became a key resource, helping pupils discover rich, exciting vocabulary.

Pupil Voice:

- *“My line was ‘When I blew the magic dust, the mountains murmured...’ — I loved making the mountains talk!”*
- *“The dictionary helped me find new words that sounded like magic.”*

At the end of the day, the class compiled their poems into a **beautiful poetry book**, ready to be displayed after Collective Worship.

Owl Class – Painting Poetry with ‘The Highway Rat’

Using *The Highway Rat* for inspiration, pupils created artwork to illustrate the poetic rhythm and imagery of the story. Their paintings captured dramatic scenes, characters and landscapes.

Pupil Voice:

- *“My painting looked like it had jumped straight out of the poem!”*
- *“I liked choosing colours that matched the words.”*

Book Swap & Reading Community

We ended the day with a joyful book swap, where children shared recommendations and chose a “new-to-you” book to take home.

It was heart-warming to see pupils sit down with their swapped books immediately, lost in their new stories.

Pupil Voice:

- *“Someone picked a book I love - I told them all the reasons why!”*
- *“I found a book I’ve never seen before and I’m going to read it tonight!”*

A Wonderful Atmosphere Across the School

During the day, the school was filled with a purposeful buzz. Children were engrossed in their tasks, collaborating beautifully across year groups and celebrating one another’s ideas.
