

Owl Class Visit to Mop End Field Centre

Outdoor learning experiences such as this help pupils develop resilience, confidence and a strong sense of teamwork, while deepening their understanding of the world around them.

Owl Class (Years 5 and 6) enjoyed a full day of outdoor learning at Mop End Field Centre, taking part in a rich and challenging programme designed to develop practical skills, teamwork and confidence in a natural environment.

The visit provided high-quality enrichment, allowing pupils to learn beyond the classroom while building resilience, cooperation and problem-solving skills.

Bushcraft and Survival Skills

During the day, pupils learned a range of bushcraft and survival skills, developing practical understanding of how humans interact with and adapt to their environment. Children listened carefully to instructions, worked safely with equipment and applied their learning with impressive focus and enthusiasm.

These activities encouraged independence, responsibility and perseverance, while reinforcing the importance of working safely and respectfully outdoors.

Den Building and Teamwork

A key highlight of the visit was the den-building challenge, where pupils worked in teams to design and construct shelters using natural materials. Pupils shared ideas, negotiated roles and adapted plans as challenges arose.

When a sudden (watering-can-based!) rainstorm appeared, pupils had the opportunity to test whether their shelters were fit for purpose. This real-life problem encouraged quick thinking, resilience and collaboration, with teams reflecting on what had worked well and what they would improve.

Orienteering and Species Identification

Pupils also took part in orienteering challenges, using problem-solving and navigation skills to move around the site, as well as an identifying local species challenge, encouraging careful observation and connection to the natural world.

These activities supported learning across geography and science while promoting physical activity and teamwork.

Teamwork, Cooperation and Companionship

Throughout the day, the levels of teamwork, cooperation and companionship were excellent. It was a genuine pleasure to see pupils supporting one another, sharing ideas and adapting plans together with maturity and positivity.

Children demonstrated:

- Strong communication and listening skills
- Resilience when faced with challenge
- Mutual encouragement and respect
- Confidence in unfamiliar situations

A Valuable Enrichment Experience
