

Aston Rowant C+E Primary School Pupil Premium Strategy 2023-24

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to maintained schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

The Pupil Premium Strategy is reviewed at the end of each summer term by the Headteacher and Governing Body. The new strategy is determined ready to start in September each year.

School's pupil premium grant allocation amount:

In planning the allocation of funds the following criteria have been considered:

- Research from the Education Endowment Foundation and Sutton Trust –Toolkit of strategies to improve learning
- Children's progress and attainment in their previous year group and setting
- The curriculum target setting for pupils
- Discussion with parents
- Arrangements for children with special educational needs and for more able children
- Additional support already provided by the school

Summary of the main barriers to educational achievement faced by eligible pupils at the school:

- Pupils not reaching the age-related expectations at the end of the last key stage;
- Medical conditions.
- SEN support in addition to PPG.
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How we will spend the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG):

Initiative/ Innovation	Amount	Impact
Residential trip financial support	£1000	Rounded education and learning opportunities
Pastoral/ Mentoring support	£12,450	Positive behaviour strategies impact on pupil's attitudes to learning across all phases

One to one and small group sessions

- Additional hours for Teaching Assistant in the afternoon to provide additional interventions in KSI and 2 • 1:1 Tuition sessions
- Support with reading/phonics, mathematics, SALT and social skills • Creation of 6 week blocks of intervention– 1 hour per day

Educational Visits

- Pupil Premium grant will fund all educational visits for all pupils.
- In Year 5/6 the children are taken on a residential trip each year. This trip enables children to participate in adventurous activities and develops social skills.

How we will measure the effect of the pupil premium:

- rates of progress pupils make in key core subjects (English, Maths and Science)
- progress that is made in 1:1 interventions
- emotional well-being
